Dear Zeta Psi Brothers,

The Dartmouth chapter of Zeta Psi is doing very well where risk is concerned. The college has been slowly rolling back COVID restrictions, and normal fraternity parties and on-night activities have returned to what it was like pre-pandemic. There were no major emergencies at the house this term affecting the safety of guests, and we received no complaints. One of the risk men printed and posted the contact information of execs to reach out to if a guest felt unsafe, as well as the numbers of college organizations like Title IX and the student wellness center. These posters were hung up in all social spaces and bathrooms in the house for easy access. No brothers or new members were fined for failing to complete their mandatory door, bar, and sober monitor duties for the term.

As always, for any on-night two brothers are stationed on the door to let in guests, check IDs for class year, and turn away problematic students. Sober monitors walk around during events to make sure no one is visibly not okay, and can offer water and help to guests who have had too much to drink. We often have two sober monitors during high-capacity events. For open to campus events advertised through the college email, brothers who are TIPS-trained (legally trained to serve alcohol) are present on bar for the duration of the event. Currently, all members other than the new members who were initiated at the end of this term are TIPS trained, and those new members will receive their training in the winter. This term has been an extremely successful one, and we can only hope that college policies remain as they are for the foreseeable future.
